

Community Links offers Supported Employment Services to help individuals locate and train for employment in the community, and to help area employers find reliable, well-trained employees for their work force.

Community Links Supported Employment provides services to help ensure a good match for both the adult seeking employment and the prospective employer. Our program serves individuals with intellectual disabilities.

Individuals will work with highly trained and professional employment specialists or “job coaches”. These trained professionals work side-by-side with the job seeker, remaining at the worksite until job duties can be preformed to the employer’s satisfaction. Staff will return to the site whenever needed to assist the employee in learning new responsibilities.



The GOAL for each supported employee is to successfully and independently maintain employment in the community.

Community Links Career Connections

Community Links Supported Employment Services provide a wide range of support services, from identifying the individual's job interests to interacting with the employer as needed.

Services to the Supported Employee include:

Community-Based Work Assessment

- Assesses job readiness, targets appropriate job matches, and recommends supports necessary to secure and maintain employment in the community



Job Development

- Provides training and assistance in all phases of the job search including creating a resume, completing job applications, development interviewing skills, contacting potential employers, analyzing potential employment sites, and reviewing specific job responsibilities prior to placement

Job Coaching and Ongoing Support

- On-site job training including 100% intensive training/support, fading or gradual reduction of support, follow-along/ periodic visits to monitor progress, and re-intervention or additional training for new tasks or to improve skills
- Off-site training for the continued development of work-related skills, social skills, money management, and transportation training is also available
- Connections to additional support and resources and assistive technology



Benefits Counseling

- Supported Employment Specialists help people understand how benefits (such as Social Security or Medicaid) are affected by working. Most people are able to work and continue to receive some benefits
